- Woodlawn Manor (Yellow House) continues to be used on a regular basis by the DAR and other organizations. We open the house for meetings and small events, provide volunteer help with coffee or other amenities. Groups may bring food if they desire. They seem to enjoy having the facility available and pay a stipend of \$100.
- Applause goes out to Frank Taylor, whose parents are buried at Woodlawn, for his donation of \$5000. We are also expecting grants from the County Commission and the City of Fairmont.

Woodlawn Projects

Here are updates on three ongoing historic projects at Woodlawn. These projects have been directed and coordinated by Raymond Alvarez, Woodlawn Board member and Marion City/County Historian. We thoroughly appreciate Raymond, the FSU students, and instructors, and the Marion County Visitor's Bureau for their leadership and expertise.

Cultural Tourism

Woodlawn received a grant of \$1,000 from the Marion County Convention and Visitor's Bureau to establish a formal training for docents for Woodlawn events. This will involve learning key historical information, the location of prominent burials, and details about the history of Woodlawn. We are hoping to train 10-15 docents. After training, we will plan various times that docents would be available for tours and special events. Dr. Raymond Alvarez is designing training manuals. The training will begin in the fall and will most likely be conducted in two workshop sessions and a walking tour. An application for training will be sent later this summer, and Dr. Alvarez and the members of the history committee will interview and determine the number for training. Of course, our target group includes our many friends of Woodlawn. Part of this will be a lesson plan for middle school WV history/social studies teachers.





QR CODES

QR code signs are now located around the cemetery. Try them out some time and listen to audio stories developed by Museum Studies students at Fairmont State University last year. Dr. Alvarez coordinated numerous student experiential learning projects benefitting Woodlawn during the past three years.

SURVEYING

The Fairmont State Surveying and Geomatics program students, under the leadership of Professor Don Teter, presented their findings earlier this month. The students were charged with surveying the approximately two-acre plot that formerly was a Fairmont City Cemetery. There are historic burials here including two black soldiers who served with the Union Army. There is additional work to be done, and a complete report will be shared with the Board in the near future. Students will continue to work on this project next year.
